The Theory And Practice Of Membership Development

Every Rotary Club worth its name will always aspire to grow the Club. To ensure that the effort expended will not be wasted, as well as to protect the Club members from unnecessary disillusionment, Rotary International has come up with simple but important steps in the process of adding and keeping new members. These are the steps:

1. If you find someone who you think will make a good Rotarian, before even inviting him/her to join, you must first be certain that the prospective candidate has the financial means, the time, and the predisposition required of a member.

2. If yes to all three, then submit his/her name to the Board, as well as his background. The Board will then ask the Membership Chair to see if the candidate indeed has the qualifications, and if a classification is vacant, and to report on his/her findings at the next board meeting. If the Board finds the candidate meritorious, it will give its preliminary approval. **THAT IS THE ONLY TIME YOU CAN INVITE HIM/HER TO ATTEND OUR REGULAR MEETING AS YOUR GUEST, BUT NOT YET INTRODUCED AS A PROSPECTIVE ROTARIAN, MERELY YOUR GUEST.**

3. The purpose of the invitation is for him/her to get a feel of the organization, and for the members to size him/her up. If he/she does not feel good, he/she will not come back. If the members do not like his/her behaviour, the sponsor is advised not to extend another invitation, unless the sponsor makes an appeal.

If the candidate(s) feels like joining, then the Club takes a vote. Two negative votes means a rejection. If he/she gets club approval, then he/she is given Rotarian Information by a qualified member, after which, the candidate first pays his/her dues and is then inducted as a regular member. Remember, if you introduce your candidate as a prospective member and the Board or the general membership will vote him/her down, you will embarrass yourself and your friend. So the prudent way is to introduce your friend as a guest. If we follow these steps, your candidate will very likely stay with us for the rest of time.



ABOUT THE NEW PRESIDENT OF THE CLUB



Boone, as he is more fondly called, once dreamed of playing professional basketball and winning the Philippines' first Olympic gold medal. Today, however, his passion for sports has given way to his devotion to his family and his commitment to the schools and businesses he operates. He is a loving husband to former college sweetheart, Jackie, and the proud father of three academically and artistically gifted children: Joan (15), David (13) and Julia (8). A multi-awarded and seasoned entrepreneur, he is the Founder and President of GNO Tech Resources and King Boone Ventures—the two companies that control and operate the most bemedalled and largest franchise network of Informatics in the Philippines and concurrently holds the master franchise rights to operate Informatics computer schools in Shenzhen, China. He is also the Chairman & CEO of Synermaxx, the first truly integrated business, internet and mobile, and product solutions company in the Philippines. He likewise sits as a member of the Board, either as President and/or Director, in several other companies engaged in property, education, business process outsourcing, advertising and sports & recreation.

A born winner with a penchant for excellence, Boone



counts amount his accolades the first-ever Franchisee of the Year (Service Category) award given by the Philippine Franchise Association in its Franchise Excellence Awards for 2004. He is also a 6-time winner of the in-house Informatics Philippines Franchisee of the Year award and a recipient of multiple citations from the Philippine Quality Awards for Business Excellence and Philippine Marketing Excellence Awards. Previously, he worked as a brand manager at Procter & Gamble Philippines and as a consultant for the Carlos Velez Group of Companies. A gifted student, Boone was a consistent math and debating champion during his scholastic days. He graduated Class Valedictorian from the Philippines' premier business school, De La Salle University-Manila (1990) with two undergraduate degrees: B.A. in Economics (*summa cum laude*) and B.S.C. in Management of Financial Institutions (also *summa cum laude*). He was also conferred with the Sixto K. Roxas Gold Medal for Excellence in Economics, and holds a post-graduate certificate in e-Business from the University of California-Berkeley Extension.

But all his accomplishments aside, Boone still finds greatest fulfillment in being able to make a tangible contribution to helping improve the lives of the less privileged. As part of his "service for others" commitment, Boone has been dedicated and active Rotarian for the RC New Manila Heights Chapter and a Board Director of the Horseshoe Village Homeowners Association for the last four years. A regular contributor to charitable institutions, he counts among his favorite beneficiaries the Tuloy sa Don Bosco Streetchildren, La Sallian Legacy Campaign, Mary the Queen Ladies of Charity, Immaculate Heart of Mary Academy Davao Mati scholars, Carewell Foundation, and of course, The Rotary Foundation. In his Informatics colleges alone, effective 4 years ago to the present day, he has generously allotted 20% of the school enrollment for partial or full scholarship grants, thus helping out countless economically challenged but academically capable students. Not surprisingly, he often publicly shares as his greatest fulfillment finding out how the many children he has helped have gone on to lead more productive lives.



MEET OUR GUEST SPEAKER

Master Andy Tan, 50 years of age, has been practicing the art of Feng Shui for more than 2 decades now. To the surprise of many, he is actually a Doctor of Medicine.
